

Part Time Position Available: Middle School Math / Instructional Assistant

Seabury is seeking a part-time teacher and/or instructional assistant for its unique middle school program.

Seabury School is seeking a talented math teacher to provide instructional support and help with student supervision at its innovative middle school. Located in the heart of Tacoma's theater district, Seabury middle school uses the city as an extension of the classroom in this integrated, project based program. Since 1989, Seabury School has served highly capable children in preschool through grade 8. The middle school program serves students in grades 6-8.

Seabury's middle school program is built around a challenging, integrated, inquiry based curriculum designed to meet the learning and developmental needs of gifted middle school students. The community serves as an extension of the classroom through partnerships with community organizations as well as a commitment to community service. Seabury's focus is on personalized learning for gifted children, allowing each student to recognize and develop his or her gifts and talents. Seabury is a small learning community and the program is designed to support the development of the whole child, with teachers working together to create a supportive, safe community of learners.

Seabury middle school's math program is designed to ensure each child is appropriately placed and challenged in math. Seabury is seeking a math teacher or well qualified math instructional assistant to assist in the math program teaching advanced middle school and high school math (pre-algebra through pre-calculus). The teacher / IA will be working under the direction of Seabury's lead math teacher with small groups and individual students, and in developing and facilitating inquiry based math activities and investigations. The teacher / IA will also assist with lunch and recess supervision. Additional hours substituting may be available depending on the qualifications of the candidate.

Teachers seeking an opportunity to be creative, collaborative and innovative in the classroom are highly encouraged to apply. Experience with or an interest in gifted education is required. Applicants for this position are encouraged to have or be in the process of obtaining a bachelor's degree and a valid Washington State teaching certificate.
